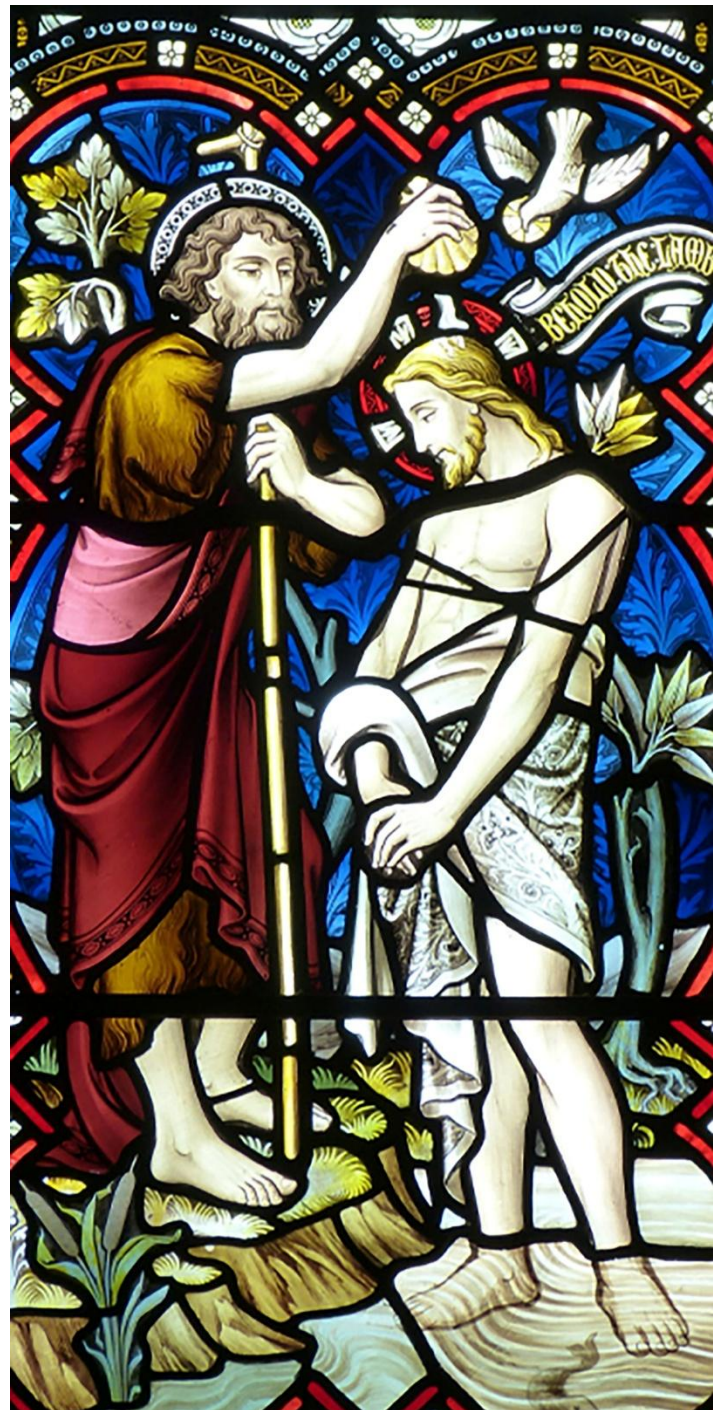


Ouch!

If you want to know about the troubles the church is having, ask someone who hasn't been there for months.

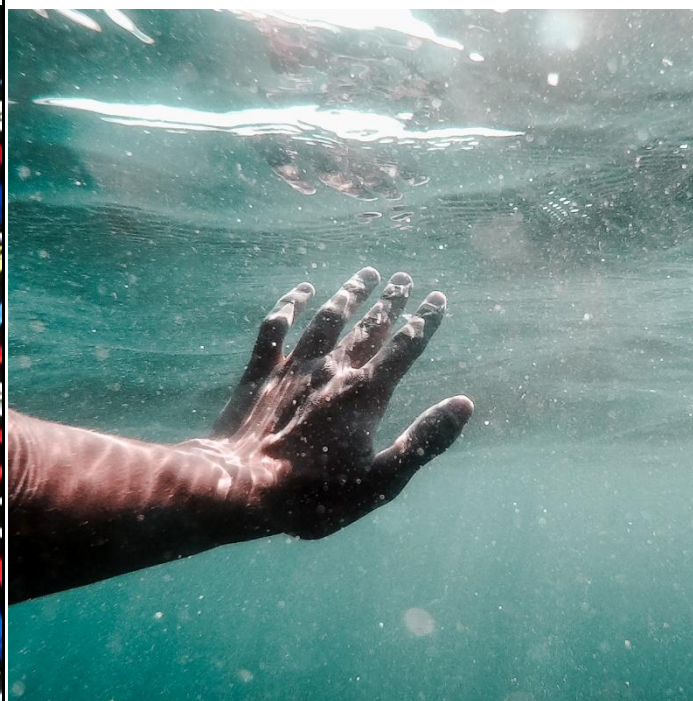


Prayer for Ukraine
